Current text

120.02 - REGISTRATION

The National Authority establishes each year a list of people to whom licences have been delivered and this is sent to the UIM Secretariat. The list must include: the name and surname, the address and e.mail, the class(es) for International Licence only. These lists may be sent to other National Authorities.

Licence numbers are given annually by the National Authority to the owners and drivers entered on the list.

Any person wishing to obtain a licence must apply to the National Authority through his club.

The licence is granted by the National Authority and is marked "International" as decided by the National Authority. Licence holders must have a current UIM rulebook. For all international endurance races, titled or not titled, only one current UIM rulebook will be required per boat, not per driver.

Any National Authority has the right to deliver licences to:

- its nationals
- nationals of another country affiliated to the UIM only with the written agreement of the National Authority of that nation.

With the approval of the UIM a National Authority may also deliver licences to persons belonging to a country which is not yet affiliated to the UIM.

Drivers are only permitted to hold licences from one National Authority.

A National Authority may refuse to give a licence. Notification of this is sent to all affiliated clubs and to the UIM.

Proposed text

120.02 - REGISTRATION

The National Authority establishes each year a list of people to whom **international** licences have been delivered and **this must be sent to the UIM Secretariat**.

The list must include: the name and surname, the address and email, the class(es) for International Licence only and the **Anti-Doping Appendix 2 of UIM Anti Doping Rules duly signed per acceptance**.

These lists may be sent to other National Authorities.

Licence numbers are given annually by the National Authority to the owners and drivers entered on the list.

Any person wishing to obtain a licence must apply to the National Authority through his club.

The licence is granted by the National Authority and is marked "International" as decided by the National Authority. Licence holders must have a current UIM rulebook. For all international endurance races, titled or not titled, only one current UIM rulebook will be required per boat, not per driver.

Any National Authority has the right to deliver licences to:

- its nationals
- nationals of another country affiliated to the UIM only with the written agreement of the National Authority of that nation.

With the approval of the UIM a National Authority may also deliver licences to persons belonging to a country which is not yet affiliated to the UIM.

Drivers are only permitted to hold licences from one National Authority.

A National Authority may refuse to give a licence. Notification of this is sent to all affiliated clubs and to the UIM.

It has to be signed and acknowledged when issuing the International Licence by his NA and entered to the UIM together with the International Licenses updated list
